ere at Petans, we have been delivering professional safety and survival training to the offshore energy sector for over 40 years.

With the end of 2024 approaching, it's a good time to reflect on the things we do that go beyond our day-to-day training delivery.

As a registered charity, we are always focused on our charitable objectives. We are also conscious of our local community and the value we can provide as part of our corporate social responsibility (CSR).

We prioritise investment in training facilities and equipment to provide high-quality training for the sector. It also allows us to offer innovative grants to support individuals, local companies and the wider energy sector.

This year we added a third grant scheme to enable those engaged with employability charities to access the safety training needed for a career in the energy sector.

The grants are something that we return as part of our charitable status, but we look to go beyond this as we engage with our community.

Earlier this year we welcomed students from Reepham, Aylsham and Cromer High Schools to engage in work experience. This saw them join our courses, giving them a taste of the training that is needed to work in the energy sector.

It was also an opportunity to interact with our staff and delegates, gaining insight into careers in the military and emergency services.

In October we welcomed a group of 20 engineering students from City College Norwich for a taster day. They enjoyed a day of theoretical and practical exercises, including the opportunity to experience helicopter underwater escape training (HUET) in the pool.

The day was a resounding success and, like the work experience, something we will repeat next year.

training and operations manager. "We love giving young people that opportunity to test themselves in new situations, and possibly do things they will never get to do again.

"We see them grow through the week and take on leadership roles in team exercises. Seeing that real sense of achievement as they gain confidence hopefully gives them an insight into their own career aspirations."

As a local employer, we believe it is important that we demonstrate our value to the community, which includes our environmental responsibilities.

Whether it's recycling our water, putting solar panels in place or looking out for the wildlife that passes through our site, we endeavour to manage our impact as best we can whilst delivering a valued service to our industry.
